





What is Tartan?

Tartan, or Highland Dress, is a Scottish icon of identification <u>throughout</u> the world. The culture of wearing Tartan began in the 19th century with <u>clans</u>, which were groups of people who lived in the Highland. In Scottish culture, there is a celebration that originated in Canada to mark the History of Tartan. It is Tartan Day, celebrated on April 6th.

The word Tartan comes from 'Tartaine,' a French word for a checked <u>cloth</u>. Also known as 'plaid', in the US, Tartan is a patterned fabric that <u>interlocks</u> coloured stripes. The fabric became a synonym for Scottish <u>heritage</u> by the popular imagination. However, the History of Tartan is older than we think it is! <u>Archaeologists</u> found a mummy in China wearing tartan-style fabric, suggesting that <u>trade routes</u> occurred centuries ago between east and west.




